

PREVENT MARINA FIRES

Marina Fire Safety Rules

- **No charcoal or wood fired grills**
propane grills are permitted as long as they are on a stable surface, always attended, cleaned of grease, and a fire extinguisher is within 5'
- **No fireworks or open flame devices including candles**
- **No open flames or sparks within 50 feet of fuel docks or fueling operations**
- **Portable fuel containers CANNOT be used - use the 2 fueling docks**
- **Smoking is highly discouraged**
- **Smoke detectors required in all float homes and boat sleeping areas**
each sleeping area, outside each sleeping area, and on each level
- **Fire extinguishers required in all float homes, sheds, and boats**
make sure they have a current inspection - within the past year
- **Report all unwanted fires, fuel spills, sinking boats and structures to the fire district immediately**

IN CASE OF FIRE

- Call 9-1-1 & Evacuate the Marina
- Shut Off Power to the Fire Area
- Keep Boats & People Away from Fire Area
- Move Parked Vehicles to Make Room for Firefighting Operations
- Clear the Boat Launch
- Assign Someone to Direct Emergency Responders

IN CASE OF

MEDICAL EMERGENCY

- Call 9-1-1 & Begin First Aid
- Make Room for Emergency Vehicles
- Assign Someone to Direct Emergency Responders

FIRE EXTINGUISHERS

Remember the P.A.S.S Word
4 basic steps to using a fire extinguisher

Pull the safety pin

Aim the hose at the base of the fire

Squeeze the handle

Sweep the hose from side to side while discharging

and **Be Prepared**



Don't force yourself to fight a fire that makes you uncomfortable or puts you at risk

Fire extinguishers are for small fires. If you are unable to put out the fire with one extinguisher, leave.

Don't let the fire come between you and your exit. Keep your back to the exit and the fire in front of you.
